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- Digoxin (Lanoxin)—Assess pulses for a full minute, if less than 60 bpm hold dose. Check digitalis and potassium levels.
- Aluminum Hydroxide (Amphojel)—Treatment of GERD and kidney stones. WOF constipation.
- Hydroxyzine (Vistaril)—Treatment of anxiety and itching. WOF dry mouth.
- Midazolam (Versed)—given

for conscious sedation. Nursing Exam Cram Sheet for the NCLEX-RN Schedule I —no currently accepted medical use and for research use only (e.g., heroin, LSD, MDMA). Schedule II —drugs with high potential for abuse and requires written prescription (e.g., Ritalin, hydromorphone (Dilaudid), meperidine (Demerol), and fentanyl).
