Yes/No questions. To create a question that will be answered with a 'yes' or 'no', use 'Had' (or 'Hadn't' for a negative question) + Past Participle form of the verb. To form the past participle: add "ed" to the infinitive form of regular verbs. We often use the past perfect to refer to situations which have changed. I had planned to go to the beach.
